


Grand Knight's Greeting

Father Funcken came to St. Agatha from Holland in 1864 and, within a year, founded St. Jerome's College, transferring it in 1866 to Berlin, now Kitchener.

This coming year will be to focus on membership and retention by being proactive within our Churches, Schools and community. This was brought forward at the State Convention in May under the Heading of Membership 365.



Hearing God's Voice...



My Brother Knights,

Later this month I will be making my annual retreat. It is wonderful to have a position that insists you take 5 days to go away from all your work to simply pray and rest. I realise that this is not feasible for most people. However, if the opportunity arises for even a weekend retreat, I encourage you to take the opportunity. Amazing things can happen on retreat, but we need to be in a position to be able to experience God's presence in order to be able to respond to Him.

So many of us live busy, hectic and even chaotic lives. It is difficult to find time to pray, yet to be able to sit quietly in God's presence. Even though it may not be possible to sit quietly with the Lord for a few days, an hour or even 10 minutes, we do need to learn how to hear God's voice in our lives in order to be able to follow Him and not get caught following other voices that are not good for us.

The Lord never tries to hide from us; He constantly calls and offers us His grace. We must learn how to respond. God calls each of us uniquely and personally. SIMPLE THINGS

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it could very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since been married, that could be updated to reflect your spouse or your children.

Most people list a primary beneficiary – that person is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary – an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.


I routinely call all of our policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.
